Thadene Roberts Exchanges Wedding Vows with William Emmett Malone

Rev. T. J. O'Sullivan officiated at Church of the Blessed Sacrament before an altar holding five-branched candelabra flanked by arrangements of candles.

Mrs. Myrth McQuagh Culp, organist, Mrs. Geraldine Shanks Wright, harpist, and Mrs. Jeannie Park Gans, vocalist, presented traditional wedding music.

The bride, given in marriage by her father, wore a gown of white French lace in rose petal design over a foundation of satin and tulle. The molded bodice had a low V-neckline with scallops of the lace forming the stand-up collar, each lace design being encrusted with pearls. Long tight sleeves ended in points at mid-hand and the full skirt, ending in a cathedral train, was styled with scalloped edges of the lace forming a redingote effect revealing a panel of sunburst pleats. Her full, circular veil of imported silk illusion fell from a coronation crown trimmed with pearls and she carried a cascade bouquet of stephanotis and white satin ribbon centered with white orchids.

Miss Mary Louise Roberts attended her sister as maid of honor and bridesmaids were Miss Dorothy Saner, Jacksonville, Ill., Miss Martha Garrett, Corpus Christi, Tex., and Miss Sophie Roberts, sister of the bride. They wore ballet-length dresses of French lace and tulle over taffeta in pastel shades of shell pink, orchid, maize and Alice blue. The strapless bodices were styled with tulle folds and the full skirts had in-

set panels of pleated tulle the length of the skirt. French lace with a flange of sunburst pleated tulle and daisies formed their hats, each matching their gowns, and they carried matching crescent bouquets of daisies.
